The hospital earned the Joint Commission's certification by demonstrating continuous compliance with its performance standards. Sepsis is a life-threatening condition that occurs when the body's immune system overreacts to an infection, causing organs to function improperly. If not recognized and treated early, sepsis can lead to shock, multiple organ failure, and sometimes death.

San Antonio Regional Hospital underwent a rigorous, announced onsite review on January 31, 2025. During the visit, the Joint Commission reviewer evaluated compliance with sepsis-related certification standards including program management, supporting self-management, and delivering and facilitating clinical care. Joint Commission standards are developed in consultation with health care experts and providers, measurement experts and patients. The reviewer also conducted onsite observations and interviews.

"Through a multidisciplinary collaboration involving physicians, nurses, infection prevention specialists, and quality improvement teams, we established standardized protocols aligned with the latest clinical guidelines. We leveraged data analytics to identify early warning signs, implemented rapid response strategies, and provided ongoing staff education to enhance early recognition and timely intervention. Our collective efforts have strengthened our ability to deliver high-quality, evidence-based care, ultimately improving survival rates and patient outcomes in the fight against sepsis."
