"ACUTE LOW BACK PAIN"

Desired Outcomes:

At the conclusion of this activity, participants will be able to:

- ❖ Follow current guidelines for the evaluation and management of acute low back pain
- ❖ Recognize the typical clinical presentation and common underlying causes of acute low back pain
- ❖ Identify red flag symptoms that may indicate serious underlying conditions requiring further evaluation or intervention
- ❖ Apply evidence-based criteria to determine when diagnostic imaging and pharmacologic therapies are appropriate in the management of acute low back pain
- ❖ Refer patients timely to physical therapy, pain specialists, or other providers based on clinical assessment and guideline recommendations
- ❖ Consider how culture impacts a patient's beliefs about back pain and communicate effectively to ensure accurate identification of symptoms and improve patient adherence to treatment recommendations
- ❖ Reflect on the patient populations most affected by acute low back pain, and consider how implicit bias may impact appropriate care of these patients
